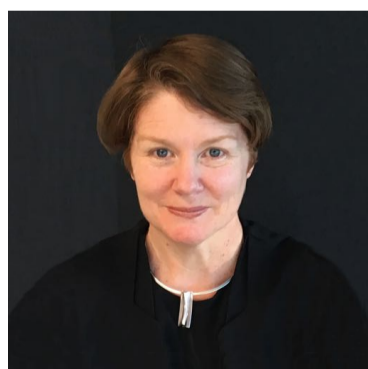

SYNOPSIS

As a follow-up to the inaugural session on Patient-Centred Outcomes That Matter, we have invited Dr Barbara Daveson to share Australia's experience in using Palliative Care Outcomes Collaboration (PCOC) to drive improvements in outcomes, through the use of a standardised clinical assessment system, common palliative care language and a tool for national benchmarking. PCOC has shown that national palliative care outcome programmes are feasible, desirable and useful in identifying needs and improving outcomes of patients receiving palliative care at institution, cluster, and national levels. PCOC has also demonstrated that nationally agreed-upon measures can identify unwarranted variations in outcomes, support systems-level enhancements and policy, and drive improvements for patients and families receiving care.
